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Dyclonine

Description:

- Local anesthetic

Indications:

- Anesthetizing accessible mucous membranes prior to endoscopic procedures
- Blocking the gag reflex
- Relieving pain associated with oral ulcers of stomatitis
- Postoperative wounds
- Ano-genital lesions

Precautions:

- Pregnancy category C
- Traumatized mucosa
- Sepsis in region intended for application
- Shock, heart block
- Children < 12 years

Adverse Reactions (Side Effects):

- CNS: depression, dizziness, drowsiness, excitation, seizures, tremors
- CV: bradycardia, cardiac arrest, myocardial depression
- GU: urethritis (when used for urethral anesthesia)
- RESP: respiratory tract
- SKIN: edema, slight irritation, stinging, swelling, urticaria

Dosage:

Administered topically

- Adult:
 - Apply to desired area as a rinse, gargle, mouthwash, spray, wet compress, or swab as needed
 - do not exceed 30 ml of 1% solution (300mg)
